



OVARIAN CANCER CANADA KEY PRIORITIES







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
Overarching priorities for SK investment **Fund the best ovarian** cancer research in the province










COMPETITION ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA



- Open to all clinical and scientific researchers studying ovarian cancer in Saskatchewan.
- Our goal is to fund the most innovative and impactful projects and initiatives with the greatest potential to benefit ovarian cancer patients in the province.
- Projects of all types, at all stages of research, and throughout the ovarian cancer continuum are eligible to apply.

TYPES OF PROJECTS MAY INCLUDE (BUT NOT LIMITED TO):



- Discovery-based, pre-clinical or translational research
- Clinical trials traditional + pragmatic
- Correlative studies on longitudinally collected clinical trial biospecimens
- Patient-centered surveys or focus groups
- Research on social determinants of health in relation to the ovarian cancer experience
- Collection and analysis of relevant health administrative data
- Implementation research
- Scientific resources e.g., research models, tissue banks, clinicallyannotated biorepositories

EVALUATION CRITERIA



- Project fit
- Scientific merit/research strategy
- Potential for impact
- Qualifications of research team/research environment
- Innovation/novelty
- Patient engagement
- Clarity of communication
- Readiness
- Strength of supporting/preliminary data
- Budget & timelines

BUDGET & STUDY TERM



- Total funding envelope of \$825,000
- Can apply for 1, 2 or 3 years of funding
- Recommended budget ranges based on study types, but no minimum/maximum enforced:

Research stage	Budget range/project
Discovery/translational	\$100,000-\$200,000
Clinical trials	\$250,000-\$500,000
Patient-centred surveys/focus groups	\$20,000-\$50,000
Scientific resources (e.g., research models, tissue banks,	\$10,000-\$50,000
biorepositories)	

ELIGIBLE EXPENSES



- Salary support to staff or trainees responsible for the work;
- Research consumables and service costs (e.g., core facilities)
- Costs related to acquisition, processing and molecular characterization of human biospecimens;
- Costs related to sharing of materials (e.g., clinical biospecimens, research models) and data to facilitate multi-institutional collaboration;
- Costs associated with data collection and analysis;
- Costs related to engaging patients in the planning and implementation of the project;
- Publication fees up to \$4,000;
- Up to \$2,000 per year for attending meetings, seminars or conferences.

INELIGIBLE EXPENSES



- Remuneration of Principal Applicant, Co-Applicants or Collaborators;
- Purchase of equipment, unless approved in advance;
- Indirect costs to institutions;
- Sabbatical or maternity/parental leave;
- Publication fees in excess of \$4,000;
- Meeting, seminar or conference expenses in excess of \$2,000 per year.

APPLICANT ELIGIBILITY



- Study principal applicant/s must hold a research position at an academic institution in Saskatchewan and be able to hold research funds at their institution.
- Study co-applicants and collaborators may be affiliated with institutions outside of Saskatchewan; however, funds must be spent within the province;
- There are NO limits on the number of applications submitted by an applicant.

- Abbreviated CV (principal applicant, co-applicants)



INDEPENDENT REVIEW PROCESS






- ✓ Individuals with lived experience of ovarian cancer receive comprehensive training from OCC on how to review scientific applications and how to apply the patient scoring rubric (relevance, importance, impact, lay summary)
- ✓ All reviewers required to sign confidentiality and conflict of interest agreements
